## Pastoral Point

### “Jesus Last 40 Days”

Luke 24:44-53

*He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms. Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures.*

*He told them, "This is what is written: The Christ will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance and forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.*

*When he had led them out to the vicinity of Bethany, he lifted up his hands and blessed them. While he was blessing them, he left them and was taken up into heaven. Then they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. And they stayed continually at the temple, praising God.*

Very few of us ever enjoy the luxury of coming to the end of even our most productive day and saying, "It is finished. I'm through. I've accomplished everything I set out to do today." Instead, most of us have a long list of things we hope to get done someday. Maybe it is a garage you intended to clean out last fall. But spring has come and now you need to mow the lawn and work in the garden. Very seldom can we just sit back, fold our arms, and say, "I've finished everything that I wanted to do." But Jesus could do that. Jesus could say, "It is finished. I have done everything that God wanted me to do."

In the wilderness Jesus conquered sin. On the cross He conquered death. In the grave He conquered hell. And now in space, as He ascends to the Father, He has conquered Satan himself. Behind Him is the persecution of men. Before Him is the applause of angels. Behind Him is a cross. Before Him there is a crown. Behind Him is Calvary. Before Him is all of heaven's glory.

Why did Jesus remain those 40 days on the earth following His resurrection? I am sure that one goal Jesus had in spending those 40 days after His resurrection was to finish teaching the apostles. He had tried to teach them again and again what was going to happen. He had told them, "I'm going to die in Jerusalem. I'm going to be buried, and on the third day be raised from the dead." And the apostles

did the same thing that you and I do every time we hear talk of death, they tried to ignore it. They pretended it wasn't there.

When Jesus said, "I'm going to Jerusalem," Peter said, "No, Lord, don't go there." Then Jesus said to him, "Get thee behind me, Satan. And He set His face steadfastly to go to Jerusalem." He needed to complete the journey God had sent Him on to go to the cross and die for our sins.

During those 40 days Jesus appeared to them again, re-emphasizing the things He had already taught them. Suddenly, all of the teachings that Jesus had shared with them for 3 years began to make sense. And a change came over them. They became excited because now they realized the truth of what Jesus had been teaching them, "So go into all the world and preach the good news to every creature. Don't place too much importance on this world. You're only going to live in it for a few years. But you have all eternity to spend with me."

Some of us still haven't learned that lesson, have we? We're all wrapped up in the "here and now," we don't really want to think about eternity. But Jesus spent 40 more days with them, re-emphasizing that death is not the end, but just the beginning. Jesus assured his disciples that though he was present to them in a limited way while in the flesh, when he left them he would fill them with his presence in a more powerful and complete sense. In John 16:7 Jesus says, "It is expedient for you that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Holy Spirit will not come." He consoles them for his bodily absence, saying that he will come to them again in an invisible but more desirable way (John 14:18-9; 16:14).

The same is true for us today. Jesus is not physically downtown in Friend. He's not on the radio or the TV or on a preaching circuit. Jesus does not stroll into the White House or the Senate; he's not standing in the courtroom when judges render decisions. Instead, what we see everywhere is people like you and me who believe in his name and are clothed in his power.

Christ sits on high, not to be remote from us. He is giving us his power so that as His people we might show forth to the world a demonstration of what his kingdom shall look like when it comes in its fullness. In His last 40 days on earth after resurrection, Jesus gave this message of hope; He will be present with, through the Holy Spirit. **Amen**

**New Bible Study

at Dorchester United Methodist Church**

**"Creed: What Christians Believe and Why"**  
by Adam Hamilton

Adam Hamilton believes that for those seeking faith, powerful answers are contained in the Apostles' Creed, a historic statement of foundational Christian faith. In this six week study, Hamilton explores, in an informal setting with a discussion group, not only what Christians believe but why it matters.

The six lessons are:

- 1) God - We must choose to believe because faith can't be proven. Beauty and the creation can lead to belief because we feel connected to something greater than ourselves. And this belief leads us to a deeper joy, peace and an abundant life.
- 2) Jesus Christ - We believe God revealed himself in Jesus Christ. And he is the Messiah, our supreme authority. The world can be a dark place, but Jesus is the light that pushes back the darkness, just as we are called to carry his light into the world.
- 3) The Holy Spirit - God's presence with us; as close as our breath. Life is harder than need be because we do not invite the Holy Spirit to be present. The Trinity is discussed using the metaphor of the atom.
- 4) The Church and the Communion of Saints - The church was Jesus' idea; bringing people together in a community that belonged to Jesus. Holy means "belonging to God." Churches have often led in changing the world, especially in social justice issues. The church puts flesh on Jesus - the body of Christ.
- 5) The Forgiveness of Sins - The creed's emphasis is not on sin, but on the forgiveness of sins. Sin means to "miss the mark." And when this happens we become alienated from each other. Why do we sin? It is inherit in who we are. God wanted to pardon humankind but it cost Jesus His life - grace does not come cheap.
- 6) The Resurrection of the Body - We must all face the fear that we will die and that all those we love will die. As Christians we can live abundant lives because our hope is in the resurrection of the body and in eternal life. What happens to those who don't believe in Jesus when they die? Hamilton explains that he trusts in God's justice, mercy and grace.
