## **Pastoral Point** **“God’s precious gift”**

### Luke 1:26-38

<sup>26</sup>*In the sixth month, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, <sup>27</sup>to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. <sup>28</sup>The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you." <sup>29</sup>Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. <sup>30</sup>But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favor with God.*

<sup>31</sup>*You will be with child and give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus. <sup>32</sup>He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, <sup>33</sup>and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever; his kingdom will never end. <sup>34</sup>"How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?" <sup>35</sup>The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God.*

<sup>36</sup>*Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be barren is in her sixth month. <sup>37</sup>For nothing is impossible with God." <sup>38</sup>"I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May it be to me as you have said." Then the angel left her.*

In this text we see God offering his gift of salvation to all people through Mary. When delivering the good news to Mary, the angel Gabriel told her that she was precious to God (Luke 1:28-30), that she should live with purpose (Luke 1:31-33) and experience God’s mighty power (Luke 1:34-38).

The Angel Gabriel greeted Mary with this words; “*you who are highly favored, you have found favor with God*”. We are told that Mary was greatly troubled by this greeting. Why would she be greatly troubled? It may well have been because she didn’t feel particularly favored by God, she may well have felt unworthy of such an honorable greeting. To the world Mary was not worth very much and she probably believed it! To the world she was an insignificant, impoverished child. And she was a woman in a culture where men ruled supreme. But in this account we are reminded that our worth in God’s eyes doesn’t depend on our age, gender or social status, our value is not dependent upon what we have achieved with our lives nor our

value upon what has happened to us in life. The youngest, simplest and most despised according to this world’s terms can have a vital faith in God and be loved deeply by him and find the true value in knowing God. In the Psalms, we are reminded that we are “*fearfully and wonderfully made*” (Ps 139:14). To God every person is acceptable; loved; favored; approved; important; valuable; dignified; distinguished; priceless; significant and we all matter to God.

Another benefit from God’s gift of Christmas is that we are given a purpose to live by. In this passage, the angel Gabriel told Mary that she will be with a child. God’s purpose for Mary was to carry the presence of an awesome King, Jesus Christ. Today God’s purpose for us hasn’t changed which to be in God’s presence through the Holy Spirit. In Ephesians 2:22 we read: “*And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling of God in which he lives by his Spirit.*” And if the spirit of God lives in us, we will live a peaceful and joyful life.

The recipients of God’s gift experience His mighty power. The angel said to Mary, “*nothing is impossible with God*”. And Mary came to see that this was true through two miraculous births, that of John the Baptist to her ageing and supposedly infertile relative Elizabeth, and through the birth of her own son, Jesus. And the point here is this; power in the Christian life is not about the quantity of our faith, it’s about the quality of our belief. Just like Mary, our faith should be to trust in God in all circumstances. When Mary was told that she will have a baby, she asked; “*how will this be?*” The answer from God’s messenger was; “*nothing is impossible with God*”. Mary’s immediate response was one of faith. “*I am the Lord’s servant; let it be to me as you have said.*” Mary gave all to God in exchange of something newer and bigger.

Remember, you too are immensely precious to your heavenly Father, He weeps over when you reject to accept the gift He brings to you through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Through Christ, God has provided our way back to him and to a whole life and a reconciled relationship with him. This is the gift and its benefits God holds out for us, not just at Christmas, but every minute of our lives.

Dear Members of the Dorchester United Methodist  
Church,

I want to thank you from the bottom of my heart for all  
of your thoughts, prayers, and generous donations.  
Your support is what keeps me going. Therapy at  
Madonna is going very well. I continue to go three  
times a week and I keep improving. Since I am  
improving, my therapists keep adding more therapy.  
Currently, I do pool therapy 3 times a week, physical  
therapy 3 times a week, and they have even added a  
bike with electrodes that help stimulate my nerves, and  
an elliptical once a week. This month, they will start me  
on the "Ekso" which is a robotic machine that helps  
move my legs while walking upright without an  
assistive device like a walker or cane.

When I am not in therapy, I am working at a dental  
office in Seward called Seward Smiles two days a  
week. It is great to get back into the work force and feel  
somewhat of my normal self. I recently purchased a van  
and got hand controls installed. I can now take myself  
to therapy and work. It feels so great to be independent.  
A part of me feels like I am 16 again and I am offering  
to make Wal-Mart runs!

I started not having any movement or feeling from the  
chest down. I did not feel the weight of my legs or even  
nerve pain; there was nothing. Now, I can feel normal  
sensation on my stomach and I can feel water  
temperature. From the waist down, my legs are still  
asleep. When your foot falls asleep and you get that  
tingling/burning sensation, that's how my legs feel all  
the time. Sounds awful, but at least I feel something. I  
am still unable to feel water temperature on my legs.  
My doctors originally told me 12 to 18 months'  
recovery and that nerves heal a millimeter a month.  
Now that I am coming up on 12 months, I am thinking  
it's going to be more like 18 months or longer. I am  
eager to see what all I get back. I know that there will  
be some permanent nerve damage, but I am hopeful that  
I will walk again without an assistive device.

Thank you again for all of your support. You are my  
prayer warriors!
